**Pierre Anctil** est professeur titulaire au Département d'histoire de l'Université d'Ottawa, où il enseigne l'histoire canadienne contemporaine. Ses principaux champs de recherche sont l'histoire de l'immigration au Québec et la culture juive de Montréal. Titulaire d'une bourse de recherche Killam du Conseil des arts du Canada (2008–2009) et de prix prestigieux, il a de nombreuses publications à son actif. Pierre Anctil est membre de la Société royale du Canada depuis 2012 et il a reçu en 2014 le Prix du Canada de la Fédération canadienne des sciences humaines pour son ouvrage intitulé : *Jacob-Isaac Segal (1896–1954); un poète yiddish de Montréal et son milieu* (Presses de l'Université Laval, 2012).

**Zachary M. Baker** since 1999 the Reinhard Family Curator of Judaica and Hebraica Collections in the Stanford University Libraries (and since 2010, Assistant University Librarian for Collection Development), served as a librarian at the Jewish Public Library of Montreal from 1981–1987. A specialist in Yiddish Studies, he also worked at the YIVO Institute for Jewish Research (New York) from 1976–1981 (as Yiddish cataloguer) and 1987–1999 (as Head Librarian). He was editor of the journal *Judaica Librarianship*, 2004–2012.

**Ira Robinson** is Professor of Judaic Studies and Director of the Institute for Canadian Jewish Studies, Concordia University.

**Eva Roskies Raby** was the Executive Director of the Jewish Public Library from June 2000 until September 2011. For seventeen years prior to that she was head of the JPL's Norman Berman Children's Library. She holds a B.A. in Joint Honours History and Political Science from McGill University, an MSc (Econ) degree in International Diplomatic History from London School of Economics and Political Science, and an M.S. in Library Science from Simmons College, Boston. Her library career included nine years as head of the Social Work Library at McGill University. On May 12, 2011 the Quebec Library Association awarded her the Anne Galler Award for outstanding library service.

**Stephanie Tara Schwartz**, PhD is research director of the Museum of Jewish Montreal and a postdoctoral fellow at Université de Québec à Montréal. Her work focuses on Sephardic, Mizrahi and Arab Jews and multicultural Jewish identity in Canada. She is co-editor with May Telmissany of the book *Counterpoints: The Legacy of Edward Said* (2010) and co-editor with David Koffman of *Canadian Jewish Studies / Études juives canadiennes*.
